Strengthening Our Mission:

Over the past three years, through our partnership consultancy with WezaCare Solutions, we have been on a deliberate journey of rethinking how best to serve not only the child, but the family and wider community. This transition, in line with the Government's directive toward a new care model, has led to the development of three core programs working together to restore children within safe, supportive family environments.

This work is led by our Director, who continues to steward and cast the vision, ensuring that every step aligns with our core mission: to move from institutional care to a holistic Child Welfare and Community-based model

◆ Family Care

Family Care sits at the heart of our work, reflecting our shift toward strengthening not just the child, but the family as a whole. Through reintegration, case management, and family strengthening, we walk closely with children and their caregivers to support safe and stable home environments.

This program also serves as the central point of connection for all our services, where both prospective and existing beneficiaries are assessed and guided toward the support that best meets their needs.

The department is led by **Edward Ng'ang'a**, whose background in Social Work and Community Development gives him a direct and practical grounding in this area. His deep passion for children and family welfare, along with his strong rapport within the community, continues to shape and strengthen this work.

As a majority of our children are now reintegrated with their families, our space is also evolving, a room that once hosted the big boys under residential care has now been repurposed for this office, now serving case management and program coordination, reflecting this transition in a tangible way.



◆ Education Support

Education Support focuses on ensuring that children are enrolled in school, remain engaged, and perform to the best of their ability—laying a foundation for a future where they can thrive and ultimately support their families.

Through tuition assistance, school transitions, and ongoing academic support, we walk alongside each child in their learning journey. Children are connected to this program through Family Care, ensuring support is appropriate and sustainable within their family context.

The department is led by **Scovia Karani**, whose background in Education, together with her enthusiasm for specialized, individual-focused interventions, brings a thoughtful and tailored approach to each child's learning needs.

The small boys' room has been repurposed to support tutoring, mentorship, and program coordination, reflecting our intentional shift toward education-centered, community-based care.



◆ Economic Empowerment

Economic Empowerment focuses on strengthening families through sustainable livelihood support, helping caregivers build the capacity to provide for their households with dignity and stability.

Through one of our main income-generating activities, Woodwork/Carpentry, youth are enrolled not only to learn a skill but also to earn a stipend while doing so. We are also training them as apprentices who will eventually increase production for our orders while creating opportunities for themselves. This program is piloting a social enterprise model that will generate revenue both through sales and paid apprenticeships, supporting the long-term sustainability of our work.

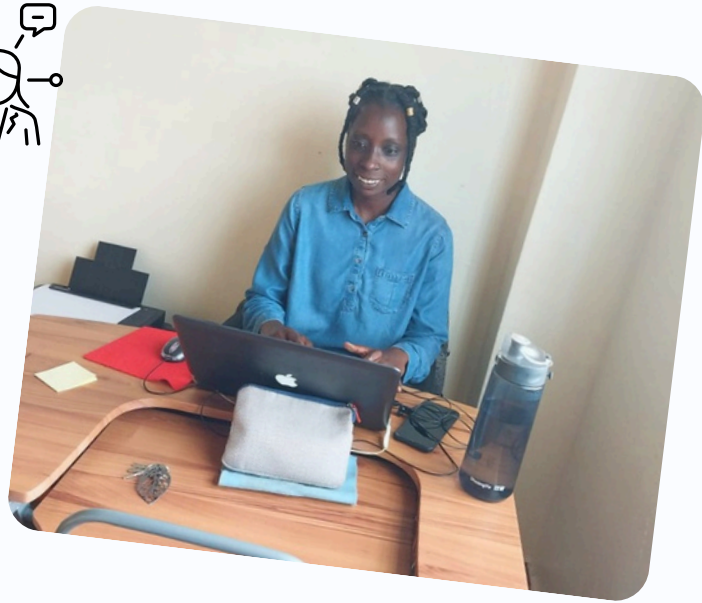
The department is led by **Vivian Mureithi**, who also serves as our Accountant. Her sharp financial outlook, combined with her background in Economics and Statistics, brings strategic insight and strong oversight to this work.

The office that formerly held our Social Work Department (now Family Care) is now occupied by the Finance and Economic Empowerment Department.

◆ Executive Administration & Human Resources

This office serves as the coordinating backbone of our work, ensuring that all programs operate smoothly, efficiently, and in alignment with our mission. The department manages operations, facilities, communications, and human capital, keeping every part of our work connected and accountable.

The department is led by **Dorothy Okumu**, whose background in Public Relations and strong knack for systems and structure help her translate vision into practical, day-to-day operations while maintaining effective coordination and relationships with both internal and external stakeholders. As our programs evolve, this office now occupies a central space that supports coordination across all areas, reflecting the practical and structural shifts that make our family- and community-based model possible.



Feed-A-Family

This month, we invite you to stand with **Monica Muchahina** and her two younger sisters, **Diana Iminza** and **Leah Wambui**, who are currently in a supported independent living arrangement.

Due to instability at home, Monica has stepped into the role of caring for her sisters. Today, they are in a safe and stable house, the younger children are in school, and Monica is pursuing hairdressing training as an apprentice, working hard to build a better future for her family.

Their most immediate need right now is **food**. Through our **Feed-A-Family** initiative, we are seeking support to ensure that this small household has consistent, nutritious meals as they continue to stabilize and grow.

A monthly food basket for the family costs **approximately 3000/=**.
