Through the first four Beatitudes from the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:3-6), they explored what it means to come before God with humility, recognizing our need for Him, understanding our brokenness, and surrendering our lives to His leading.

They also reflected on living differently: walking in meekness (strength under control) and developing a desire for righteousness that comes through Christ. These lessons were brought to life through engaging discussions, games, visits from guests, and moments of celebration through prizes and awards making the experience both meaningful and enjoyable.
